The Role

This is a unique opportunity for the successful candidate to develop a broad understanding of the lithographic print production process working on state-of-the-art offset printing presses through a two year apprenticeship.

Machine printers, also known as print 'minders', operate and maintain printing presses. The work involves taking instructions from the press operator and setting up the press with the right materials for the production run.

Full on the job training will be provided on all aspects of the job. The successful candidate will learn and progress to:

- Matching colours to the pre-press proofs.
- Assisting in the set-up and running of the press.
- · Restocking ink levels.
- Feeding the print materials into the presses.
- Putting job data into computerised control units.
- · Carrying out quality checks during the print run.
- Identifying problems and fixing faults.
- Cleaning presses after a print run has finished (either manually or using automatic cleaning systems).
- · Carrying out basic machine maintenance.
- Make the press ready.
- Run the press.
- · Control output and quality.
- · Plan and implement maintenance.

The successful apprentice will also study the following:

- The City & Guilds Level 2 Award in Printing and Graphic Communications
 - Machine Printing qualification.
- Employment Rights & Responsibilities (ERR).
- Personal Learning & Thinking Skills (PLTS).
- Functional Skills in Maths, English and ICT.
